Welcome: by Doug Steinxr

Good morning friends and welcome to this time of worship and reflection. I have been impressed with the realities that we are at a threshold in many ways. The virus is still here and we are returning to some activities. Protests across the country are calling us to new levels of awareness and justice. And, we are approaching a time we will resume meeting together as a church community. I am reminded of the Israelites coming out of the wilderness after 40 years of hardship. Moses records books and books of instructions to the community as they prepare to enter the promised land. (It is okay to go into your neighbor's vineyard and eat as many grapes as you want, as long as you don't put any in a container! Deut 23:24).

In Deuteronomy 29:2-6, we read:

Moses summoned all Israel and said to them: You have seen all that the Lord did before your eyes in the land of Egypt, to Pharaoh and to all his servants and to all his land, the great trials that your eyes saw, the signs, and those great wonders. But to this day the Lord has not given you a mind to understand, or eyes to see, or ears to hear. I have led you forty years in the wilderness. The clothes on your back have not worn out, and the sandals on your feet have not worn out; you have not eaten bread, and you have not drunk wine or strong drink—so that you may know that I am the Lord your God.

Let's not rush back to "normal". It is not easy. Maybe God "has not given you a mind to understand". This threshold has much to teach us.

Opening prayer:

Lord, we open our hearts and minds before you this morning, soaking in the beauty of your creation, wrestling with the challenges of your teachings, and comforted by the love of our

church community. Open our eyes to see and our ears to hear that we may walk humbly and obediently in your way.

Old Testament reading: Deuteronomy 26: 1-11

Offering & prayer: consider what you will offer to God this week

Lord, you call us out of captivity into the freedom of your beloved community. As we pass through the wilderness spaces of our lives, grant us ears to hear you, eyes to see you, and hearts that ache for you, that we might not turn away from the brothers and sisters who help us remember who we are.

May our offering be a sign of our attempt at obedience and may it be a blessing to others.

Questions for reflection:

- 1. What emotions do you notice in different people in the story? Who are you in the story?
- 2. In what ways is this passage a conversation about money and wealth, <u>and</u> our faith and relationship to God? How does Jesus link the two themes?
- 3. What criteria do you use for distinguishing between *needs* and *wants*?
- 4. Beryl Jantzi, of Everence, wrote in response to this Bible story: "The 'sin' is not the wealth itself. It is what wealth can do to us if we are not connected to the heart of God." What "assets" besides money (or what attitudes) do you possess that could become a barrier to your ability to connect to the heart of God? How are your working to release those barriers?
- 5. Many of Jesus' followers were not wealthy, but some were. What examples can you think of (from the Bible or your experience) of people who used their wealth to help grow the kingdom of God?
- 6. What encouragement or challenge do you hear God saying to you through this scripture at this time?
